Refreshments are served and there is no charge for attending. A two course lunch, cooked in our own kitchen, is available at the subsidised price of £4.

<u>ORCAM</u>

From the New Year we are very pleased to announce that we will be selling the OrCam in our Equipment Centres in both our Sheffield and Rotherham Centres, OrCam is a portable, artificial vision device that allows visually impaired people to read text, identify objects and recognize faces. We will be launching the product on the 8th January in Sheffield and the 15th January in Rotherham. Come along and try the device, staff will be available to show you how to use the product and illustrate just how OrCam can increase independence for blind and partially sighted people.

LOW VISION SERVICES

Do you have Low Vision?

Are you struggling to read? Is your magnifier working as well as it was? Visit the Low Vision clinic to see if we can help you with your reading, we have different magnifiers of different strengths that may help make the most of your vision.

How do you access the low vision clinic?

If you have been to the clinic before, please call **0114 271 1581** and we can book you another low vision appointment.

If you have not been before ask any eye clinician at the Royal Hallamshire Hospital for a referral to the Low Vision Clinic. If you are not under the eye department you can ask your optician or GP to refer to the eye clinic.

Please bring your glasses (reading and distance) and any low vision aids with you for your appointment.

Where is the Low Vision Service?

The clinic is held in the Low Vision Suite in the Ophthalmology Department at the Royal Hallamshire Hospital.

The Ophthalmology department is located on A Floor of the Outpatients building opposite the hospital's multi-storey car park. The reception staff will be happy to show you to the Low Vision Suite when you arrive.

<u>AUDIO DESCRIBED</u> <u>PERFORMANCES AT</u> <u>SHEFFIELD THEATRES.</u>

SENIOR SNIPPETS

Welcome to the latest edition of Senior Snippets: the monthly advisory column with the older members of our community in mind, brought to you by Bryn Evans of Home Instead Senior Care in Sheffield and Barnsley.

In this instalment, I will be sharing some tips that will keep you warm and protect your home from the inevitable cold days of winter. Although it may seem like summer has just ended, the days are getting shorter and colder and it's time to start thinking about ways to winter proof your home.

Get your boilers looked at: A poorly maintained boiler wastes energy and creates added costs. It also runs the risk of leaking carbon monoxide. So, it's a good idea to service your boiler every year. As everyone starts to switch on their central heating, the surge in gas consumption can lead to a big increase in boiler breakdowns.

Bleed the radiators: A great way to warm up your home is to bleed your radiators. This releases any trapped air, allowing hot water to fill every part of your radiator and warm your home more efficiently.

Guttering: As leaves start falling, gutters and drainpipes will start to get filled with loose foliage. Once the blockage becomes too much, water will start to back up in the guttering and leak into the roof and down the walls of the house. Make sure your gutters are completely free from grime and dirt to minimise water blockage.

No entry for draughts: Those chilly winters will try everything they can to slip through the nooks and crannies of your home. Check the edges of your doors and windows for draughts, and you can either seal these gaps with self-adhesive draught strips, or get one of those funny draught excluders shaped like a snake or a dog.

Keep your pipes warm: Burst pipes are common during winter due to rapid freezing and thawing, potentially causing massive damage. The best way to stop this from happening is to keep your pipes warm with their own foam cardigan (called lagging), which will reduce the heat lost and insulate the pipes to stop them from freezing.

Sweep your chimneys: If your chimneys are in use, make sure that they get swept every year. This will remove the build-up of dirt and grime from your chimney walls.

Bonus tip: Stock up on hot chocolate and other warm drinks. It doesn't matter if it's pouring down with freezing cold rain, in the middle of a blizzard or gale force winds, sitting down on the sofa with a mug of hot chocolate in winter is one of the best feelings ever.

We know it can be tough to keep everything in your home running smoothly during the colder months, but hopefully some of these tips will help and it is always best to start preparing your home for the winter months early.
