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
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INTRODUCTION

ARUNDEL GATE TEMPORARY BUS CHANGES



From 7th May, for approximately 10 weeks, there will be 6 bus routes disrupted by works on Arundel Gate. The affected bus services are: 1/1a, 7/8/8a and X1.

Sheffield Bus Partnership has worked together to redirect and allocate alternative city centre bus stops for all services that usually call at stops AG4 and AG5, located outside Arundel Gate Mini Interchange, to minimise disruption to passengers while the works take place.

<u>ROTHERHAM</u>

Last September we were approached by Rotherham council who had reviewed their service provision for people with a sensory impairment and wanted to partner with **SRSB** to develop their service provision across the Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council area. We are therefore contracting with Rotherham council to deliver a range of services which includes us establishing a centre in Rotherham.

We have identified a suitable building on Ship Hill in Rotherham, which is very close to the Town Hall and within walking distance of the bus interchange. We anticipate that we will be opening this new centre in late June or early July. We intend that we will have a cafe, equipment centre and technology training. We also hope to provide a base for a variety of selfhelp, sports and leisure groups etc. Our team of Community Advice Officers will also be operating throughout Rotherham and using the Rotherham Centre as a base.

As this is a sensory service we will also be delivering services to deaf people, both hearing aid users and British Sign Language (BSL) users, as well as people with a dual sensory loss (deafblind).

We have already had the first meeting of a service user group with representatives from visual impairment, hearing impairment, BSL users and Deafblind groups already operating in Rotherham. This first meeting was very positive and they have agreed the name for the service which is "Rotherham Sight and Sound".

We will keep you updated with developments.

Our annual Day Trip this year is to Cleethorpes. It will take place on Friday, 7th July and will cost £5 per person (up to a maximum of 2 people per booking.)

The pick-up point is Pond Street Interchange, stands E4/E5/E6, with the coaches leaving at 8:30am. Coming back we will be leaving Cleethorpes at 4:30pm.

LOW VISION DEMO DAY

Tuesday 23rd May, 10am to 3pm

Join us at our Mappin Street Centre to see products from Professional Vision Services and British Wireless for the Blind Fund.

Professional Vision Services will be demonstrating their latest products including video magnifiers (both desk based and portable), a video magnifier that will also read out the document, braille devices and scanner readers.

British Wireless for the Blind Fund (BWBF) will be demonstrating their latest range of radios some of which also have CD players and/or usb memory stick players as well.

SRSB are the local agents for BWBF and we are able to issue radios on free loan to people subject to them meeting certain criteria.

ONLINE TODAY

Tuesday 30th May

In conjunction with RNIB we have two training sessions for people wanting to use a smartphone or tablet (Apple or Android).

The morning session is primarily aimed at beginners who have not used a smartphone or tablet and wish to find out how they might use one.

The afternoon session is primarily aimed at people who already have a device and want to find out how to use it more effectively. People attending this session are encouraged to bring their device with them.

STAFF NOTICES

We are sorry to report that our Mobile Information Officer, Julie Turnbull, will be leaving SRSB at the end of May. In the time that she has been with us she has brought some valuable and new projects to SRSB which have been a fusion between her past experience of lecturing and designing products for maximum accessibility. The Please Touch project with Sheffield Hallam University which directly involved members of the Reminiscence Group in working with two PhD students to create an interactive exhibition at the Old General Post Office in Fitzalan Square is an example of this. Julie took over the running of **SRSB**'s Gardening Group from two student Occupational Therapists and worked alongside volunteers at Meersbrook Walled Garden to make a welcoming and inclusive place for some of our clients who have experienced sight loss as a result of brain injury.

As Mobile Information Officer, Julie has worked alongside many volunteers with the MIU, which has certainly been the most enjoyable and effective way to engage with people out at community events, whether summer or winter, inside or out in the elements. The main objective was to get people talking about their eyesight and inform them how they can keep their eyes healthy, and to emphasise how **SRSB** can support anyone experiencing sight loss.

We are sorry to lose Julie but wish her all the very best for her next venture.

CHILDREN'S SERVICES

Little Sparklers

We still continue to get new faces attending and have a strong core group of regulars. We are having regular music sessions with Rhythm Time and we have also started to have use of the sensory room and hydrotherapy pool at Ryegate Children's Centre. We have a summer outing for Sparklers booked for July to Butterfly World.

Youth Club

We have had a range of sessions with our young people including a visit to The Climbing Works, a trip to Cleethorpes, a games evening and a visit from a Careers Coach. We now have a regular group of young people attending. Forthcoming ideas include making a video about sight loss and a 'Come Dine With Me' style cooking session.

CULTURE CLUB

We've started the year with a number of theatre trips including Gaslight, Full Monty, Jane Eyre.

We also went to a fantastic production of Casanova by Northern Ballet. VocalEyes held a very informative pre show workshop which really enhanced the experience for our clients.

We have lots of shows coming up including Shirley Valentine, Dirty Dancing, Crazy for You, Dreamboats and Petticoats, The Wedding Singer, The Adam's Family and The Wizard of Oz. We are just about to make some bookings from the new season's shows including Mama Mia, Around the World in 80 Days and Little Mermaid.

By the time you read this we will have been on our first outing which was to Bishops House where we are having a private tour and talk. We then have trips booked to the Chatsworth RHS Flower Show (which has proved very popular), Media City, Rufford Abbey and Beamish.

We have a small group of clients involved in a Hull City of Culture project to create a sculpture which will be placed in the foyer at Hull's Eye Hospital – this is in conjunction with Hull & East Riding Institute for the Blind. The clients will be taking part in a number of structured sessions to help create the art work using their experience to influence the design. A number of local blind societies are involved and a group trip to Yorkshire Sculpture Park has been arranged for later this month to hopefully give them some inspiration. The clients will then be attending the unveiling in October.

SHEFFIELD MACULAR SOCIETY

Degeneration of the macular results in loss of central vision. It is usually a result of ageing and is the most common form of sight loss in older people. This group, which is a branch of the national Macular Society, meets on the first Thursday of each month (except January and August) at 1:30pm to begin at 2pm in the Central United Reformed Church Café off Norfolk Street. New members are most welcome: just come along.

RP SUPPORT GROUP

<u>CHARLES BONNET</u> SYNDROME (CBS) SUPPORT GROUP UPDATE

Charles Bonnet Syndrome is not a cause of sight loss, more a result of sight loss, but this worrying condition causes hallucinations, resulting in people, or their family/friends, wrongly believing that they may have mental health problems.

CBS or 'Phantom Visions' as the syndrome is often called, can be a very worrying side effect of sight loss, where the brain tries to compensate for not seeing by creating visual hallucinations or sees things which are not really there. They may be simple images such as grids and patterns, or elaborate, complex images of objects including animals, people or landscapes.

Charles Bonnet hallucinations are not a sign of dementia or any other sort of mental illness. They are a normal response of the brain to the loss of vision.

People who experience these hallucinations can benefit from attending our support group which takes place at the centre each month. You can speak freely with other people who understand and are experiencing similar hallucinations. It is a huge relief for many people to be able to do this. Just contact **SRSB** if you would like to attend this support group which is facilitated by volunteer Bessie Goddard.

There is also a national website for a Campaign Group called Esme's Umbrella where there is lots of useful information about this condition and their aim is to work towards a greater awareness of Charles Bonnet Syndrome. They also have a very useful leaflet that you can download to take to your Doctor if you suspect that you may have Charles Bonnet Syndrome in case they have not yet encountered the condition. They plan to travel by Andrew's coaches and pick up from the Sheffield Interchange E5/E6 at 12 noon, The Factory Shop on Woodseats at 12.20pm and The Norton Pub at Meadowhead at 12.30pm. They will arrive in Nottingham and have the afternoon there before making their way to the theatre for 7.30pm. There is also a touch tour available at the theatre from about 6pm. LONDON MARATHON

SRSB were fortunate this year to be awarded 4 places for the Virgin Money London Marathon on Sunday 23rd April. So who was to run for us? Well the team comprised of our client Nicky Gardner and her guide Craig Rush. Many of you may remember Nicky from her time working in our Equipment Centre. The other "volunteers" who came forward were **SRSB** volunteer Steve Hartley and supporters Sam Chu and Richard Stuart. So then the hard work begins; hours of training ahead in all weathers, lots of aches and pains and "I can't do it". Nicky had never run outside before, she joined a gym as she didn't think she could do it being blind which is where personal trainer Craig stepped in with his support. Another hurdle was that prior to taking on this challenge Nicky had only run in a 10k race so to jump to 42.2 kilometres was some challenge!

The team have had an amazing journey leading up to the marathon; they have worked so well together fundraising for **SRSB**. They organised a joint fundraising event at Virgin Money Lounge, store collections and bag packs plus lots more. The team set themselves a target of £10,000, a fantastic amount.

So the day dawned – the aim was for us all to meet at Cannon Street station at 7:30am; not good for supporter and Fundraising Manager Sue who is definitely not a morning person! We had a few hitches including Sam who got on the wrong train! we had countless visits to the toilet as the nerves were kicking in. It was an amazing experience as thousands of runners boarded the trains; we saw Mr Men, Monkeys, Rhinos you name it we saw it - how on earth people could run in fancy dress! It's unbelievable the lengths people put themselves through to help others.

Like a Mother Hen, Sue got all the runners to the Green Start at Greenwich with time for another visit to the toilet before the start. The atmosphere was electric there was a smell of rubbing oils and suntan in the air as the sun shone through. The band played as the starting gun banged and they were on their way.

There was a special app set up for the race which allowed us to follow all the runners during the race. It meant we could hop on the tube/train and cheer our runners on at various parts of the routes. So armed with jelly babies and **SRSB** balloons the cheering began. Craig, always the joker, was leading the singing whilst running! Poor Richard hit "the wall" at 23 miles he said his head knew what it wanted to do but his legs weren't listening! But with knees folding he ran on and we are delighted to tell you that all our runners completed the race with a smile on their face.

We can't possibly imagine the pain they went through for SRSB, running 26 miles in the heat. And for Nicky without her Guide Dog, tethered to Craig, not able to see but just hearing the surrounding noise and the pounding of feet around her, WOW! But we do know we are extremely proud of them all for what they have achieved and very grateful for the amount they raised for SRSB. We know running is not for everyone but as this newsletter goes to print their fundraising total is just over £9,000 so they are getting very close to their target of £10,000. PENFRIEND TIP

Graham Marshall's tip on how to avoid problems using a penfriend label reader.

I was one of the early buyers of this fantastic talking label system and although it is very good, over a long period there can be unexpected problems when you need to buy more labels once the supplied ones are in use or have been discarded.

I was already aware that when buying more labels you MUST buy a different set than the ones you have already bought a year or so earlier. This is because it would be easy to put say a new label on a tin of beans not realising that a label with the exact same number on it is already stuck on a CD or Cassette in your music collection. The result would be that you would find the tin of beans OK, but much later when looking for a particular CD, on touching the label, instead of it saying Abba's greatest hits, it would say 'baked beans'. This happened to me and I had been aware of the potential problem right from the start. So even though I thought I had it licked, I had made this very mistake. I found a number of other CDs that had also turned into drawer labels and other stuff.

If you need to buy more labels, ALWAYS buy a different set i.e. if you have just used your last 'Set A' ones make sure you buy a 'Set B' and so on.

Ultimately, if you do make a mistake, don't worry! From then on, to avoid over-writing messages unwittingly, just try reading every new label before use. If it is silent, you know you are alright. If the label unexpectedly says a message back to you, simply throw it away WITHOUT deleting or changing it. – Stick to this and you will be alright.

DISABLED ACCESS DAY AT BARCLAYS IN SHEFFIELD

Here is a quick note from Gail Fagan who attended the event.

"On Friday 10th March Jane and I went to Barclays Bank on the corner of Pinstone Street and Barkers Pool as part of their Disabled Access Day. We were warmly greeted by Stuart, the Manager, who introduced us to several members of staff. After an introduction by Jane she told them about **SRSB** and their role in supporting people with sight problems. I then spoke about what **SRSB** meant to me as a client.

The staff then all tried on the "Sim Specs" and asked lots of questions. All the staff were very friendly and the atmosphere was very relaxed.

Next, Jane set up the **SRSB** stall, I volunteered for balloon blowing and Jane had also taken some equipment from the shop at **SRSB**.

Stuart spoke about their talking cash machines and as I have never tried one I quickly volunteered in trying this out; after a brief orientation of the cash machine Stuart handed me a pair of headphones and I was ready to start. After plugging the headphones in I was asked to press 5 to begin, asked to put my pin number in then asked to press 1 for a receipt or 2 if not needed, then asked to press 1 for £10, 2 for £20 etc. After pressing the amount required to my great amazement the money popped out. I have not used a cash machine for 30 years and it was quite exhilarating.

This simple task that sighted people take for granted really does seem like a great mystery to myself as a blind person. I now feel confident in using this branch, taking along my headphones and drawing out cash independently."
